County (to be summoned by their sheriff who is to attend their survey & more force if any shall be offered) & sworn before a justice of the peace do go upon the lands of the S. Moses Thorp and Charles Baps what they have refused to have procipioned as aforesaid survey and lay off the same according to the most known ancient & reputed bounds thereof having regard to all statutes & evidences that shall be produced by the S. parties & it is further ordered that the jurymen return a fair plain report of his proceedings hereon to the Court & that the S. Moses Thorp & Charles Baps pay the Costs of the S. survey & proceedings

A Commission for the examination of Mary the wife of W^m Andrews with a certificate of the occasion thereof was this day returned & ordered to be recorded

An Indenture of Giftment from Thomas Davis of the one part to Edwin Gray of the other part was proved by the oath of John Cobb one of the witnesses thereto & having been before proved by the oath of the other witnesses is ordered to be recorded

On the Motion of John Person his petition for building a Mill is dismissed

A report about a mile petitions for by John Colthrop was this day returned in these words to wit "By Dues and in obedience to an order of Court herewith annexed for the Supervisors a jury of freeholders of the Vicinage being duly summoned and sworn before William Blunt Gent. of the justice of the peace of the County of Virginia and County of Southampton have diligently viewed and examined the Land in the said order mentioned & do report that the acre of Land petitioned for is of the Value of Twelve hundred Eight Pence half Penny & that the building the Mill will be to the damage of John Person eighteen Pound fifteen Shillings also to the damage of Benjamin Clifton twenty four Pound four Shillings also to the damage of John Gray one pound fifteen Shillings also to the damage of the said John Person a proportion of any other person as persons whatsoever given under our hand & seal this second day of September
