The persons appointed to make partition and division  
of the land & slaves in the bill mentioned this day returned their report  
in the words following to wit: Agreeable to an Order of Southampton  
court no. the subscribers have divided & set a part John Bynum (Cptn  
of William Bynum's decd.) proportion of land & Negroes of the estate of  
Michael Bynum's decd. as followeth (to wit). The land beginning at a  
Gum in the upper branch on -Bordall Norfflets line, thence by a line  
of marked trees to a persimmon tree, thence along a line of marked  
trees to a red oak on a road. Thence along the road to Benjamin  
Fisher's line, thence along Fisher's line to John Williamson's line,  
thence along Williamson's line to the aforesaid Norfflets line & thence  
along Norfflets line to the beginning containing One hundred acres  
more or less & a negro girl called Sall with an addition of Fowler  
pounds ten shillings as her part of land & negroes of the aforesaid  
Estate 5<sup>th</sup> May 1799. Recd. - Absent, Bordall Norfflet, John Powell.  
Whereupon it is deemed expedient that the said report be made the decree.
