

In the Indenture of Jeoffment between James Ingram and Mary his wife of the one part and William Peterson of the other part was proved by the oaths of James Taylor and E. Morgan two of the witnesses thereto and acknowledged by Mary wife to the said Ingram she being first truly examined as the law directs and continued for further proof.

The last will & testament of William Joyner deceased was presented in court by William Joyner and Lawrence Joyner two of the Executors therin named and proved by the oaths of Richard Kelly and Micajah Griffin two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probat Chonofia sue form giving security. Whereupon the said William Joyner and Lawrence Joyner with Arthur Bowin, John Johnson and Micajah Griffin their securities entered into and acknowledged their bonds in the penalty of Five thousand pounds current money for the due & faithfull administration of the said decedents estate and performance of his will.

Ordered that Brevy: Ruffox, Joseph Crawford, Brother Charles & Henry Joyner or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves & of any personal estate of William Joyner deceased and return the appraisement to the next court.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the Parish of Nottebury bind out Benjamin Scobell & Jordan Scobell poor children of Daniel Scobell according to law.

A Deed of Trust from Nathaniel Totts to Thomas Lane was acknowledged by Thomas Lane and having been at the last court acknowledged by Nathaniel Totts is ordered to be recorded.

A Concession of the peace & commissior of Oye & terminer from his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor John Page directed to Abingdon Jones, James Ridley, Nicholas Knight, Henry Taylor, Charles Briggs, Benjamin Ruffox, Edwin Gray, Thomas Black
