The account current of the administration of the estate of Henry Johnson dead, was reported pursuant to the order of this court by the persons appointed to settle the same & ordered to be recorded.

The account current of the administration of the Estate of John Bathon dead, was reported pursuant to the order of this court by the persons appointed to settle the same & ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Benjamin Clements jr. Will^m Simmons & John Simmons ^(or being) & Benj^m Terry or any three of them let the repairing of the Apomocoe bridge to the lowest undertaker and make report thereof to this court.

John Simmons is by the court appointed surveyor of the highway in the room of John Wears who is discharged from that office.

Ordered that Joshua Nicholson, Hardy Harris, Henry Applegate & Howell Myrick or any three of them let the repairs of ^{over the four miles} Moore's bridge to the lowest undertaker and make report thereof to this court.

Ordered that William Blunt, John Redgum, John Mandell and John Person or any three let the repairs of the flat swamp bridges near Mandell's to the lowest undertaker and make report thereof to this court.

On the complaint of Edward Griffen an apprentice, against John Pond his master, this day came the said parties who being fully heard and divers witnesses being examined on both sides, it is the opinion of the court that the said complaint be dismissed and that the said apprentice return to his master.
