

An indenture of feoffment between Edmund Courmpler of the one part and Benjamin Courmpler of the other part and a memorandum of livery and seisin thereon endorsed were proved by the oaths of John Russell, John Britt & Bryant Courmpler the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between John Goodrich of the one part and John Mercer of the other part and a memorandum of livery & seisin thereon endorsed were proved by the oaths of John Russell & James Mercer two of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof.

The last will & testament of John Fort dead, was presented in court by William Turner one of the Executors therein named, the other refusing and proved by the oaths of Solomon Cooper, Harris Johnson & Thomas Turner the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said William Turner with forciniah Drows his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five hundred pounds current money of Virginia for the said William's due & faithful administration of the said decedents estate and performance of his will.

Ordered that Robert Bittle, John Darrow, Jesse Drows and Thomas Turner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county to appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of John Fort dead & return the appraisement to the next court.

An indenture of feoffment between Thomas Robinson and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and James Hough of the other part with the receipt were acknowledged by the said Thomas Robinson and Elizabeth his wife she being first privately examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between William Hines senior of the one part and Samuel Hines of the other part was proved by the oath of William Hines one of the witnesses thereto, and having been before a court held on the 10th day of March 1697 proved by the oaths of the two other witnesses is ordered to be recorded.
