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a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the
Phebe Lundy and Lewis Thorpe with John Claud and James
their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the
penalty of Ten thousand pounds for the due & faithful admini-
stration on the said decedents estate and performance of his will.
Ordered that John Myrick, Joseph Reese jr. Edward Han-
Thomas Turner or any three of them being first sworn before
justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money
slaves if any and personal estate of Byrd Lundy dead, and
the appraisement to the next court.

The last will and testament of James Wright dead. was pro-
duced in court by Joseph Wright the Executor therein named, pro-
ved by the oaths of John Russell and Ledbetter Love two of the
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the
Executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted
for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form giving security. Where-
upon the said Joseph Wright with John Russell his securities entered
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Four
thousand pounds for the due and faithful administration on the
decedents estate and performance of his will.

Ordered that Edmund Jenkins, Robert Williamson, Bryant
Crumpler and Benjamin Crumpler or any three of them be-
ing first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise
in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of James
Wright dead, and return the appraisement to the next court.

A writing purporting the last will and testament of James
Ridley dead. was produced in court by Mary Ridley widow &
next of kin of the deceased, proved by the oaths of Charles Postle
of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the
motion of the said Mary Ridley who made oath according to law
certificate is granted her for obtaining letters of administration on
the said will annexed on the estate of the said decedent giving
security. Whereupon the said Mary Ridley with Dan Fisker her
securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty
of Ten thousand pounds for the due and faithful administration
on the said decedents estate and performance of his will.
