The Indenture of feoffment between Moses Phillips and Martha his wife of the one part and Newnam Branch of the other part with the receipt was acknowledged by the said Moses Phillips and continued for Martha Phillips his wife.

The indenture of feoffment between John Hardgrove and Ann his wife of the one part and William Barker of the other part with a memorandum of livery and seisin and a receipt theron endorsed were acknowledged by the said John Hardgrove and Ann his wife she being first privily examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded.

The Inventory and appraisement of the estate of John Buffkin deceased was returned and ordered to be recorded.

The Indenture of feoffment between Thomas Ellisor of the one part and Charles Barrett of the other part was proved by the oaths of Arthur Boving and William Urquhart two of the witnesses thereto and the receipt theron endorsed was proved by the oath of William Urquhart one of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof William Urquhart's account against the commonwealth for bacon furnished to the amount of Twelve pounds six shillings and ten pence half penny to the widow of Salathiel Lewis a continental soldier is adjudged reasonable.

The last will and testament of Benjamin Kiteken deceased was presented in court by Frederic Kiteken the Executor therin named proved by the oaths of Anselon Jones and Charles Briggs two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Frederic Kiteken with Franklin Clark his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One thousand pounds for the said Frederic's due and faithful administration on the said decedents estate & performance of his will.

Ordered that James Jones, Joshua Wood, Richd. Brown and Moses Wood or any three of them being sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Benjamin Kiteken deceased and return the appraisement to the next court.
