 year 1777 Eight pounds eight shillings and one penny and in the year
 Thirty pounds eleven shillings is judged reasonable and it is ordered
 same be satisfied in such manner as the law directs.

The indenture of indentment between William Brittle of the one part
 Samuel Brindsons widow of the other part was proved by the oath of
 Atkinson one of the witnesses thereto and having been before on the
 day of March 1778 proved by the oaths of two other witnesses is ordered
 to be recorded.

The Inventory and appraisement of the Estate of Joseph Cobb dec'd
 returned and ordered to be recorded.

The indenture of indentment between John Watkins and Sarah
 wife and Lucy Bennett of the one part and Nathaniel Coker of the
 part and the receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the
 John Watkins, Lucy Bennett and Sarah the wife of the said
 she being first privately examined as the law directs and ordered
 recorded.

John Clayton & Lewis Joyner produced commissions from
 Excellency the Governor to be Captains of the militia of this county
 which were read and thereupon the said John Clayton and
 Lewis Joyner having first ^{taken} the oath &c. were sworn Captains and
 Isaac Williams, Stephen Summerell and Thomas Turner
 and commissions from his Excellency the Governor to be second
 lieutenants of the militia of this county, which were read
 thereupon the said Isaac Williams, Stephen Summerell &
 Turner having first taken the oath of fidelity to the commonwealth
 were sworn second lieutenants accordingly.

When a recognizance entered into by John Tirby for begotting
 child on the body of Jane Clemmels before Benjamin Hall
 justice of this county. Whereupon the said John Tirby with
 Tirby jun^r his security entered into and acknowledged their
 in the sum of One hundred pounds each to be levied of their
 two goods and chattels to the commonwealth render'd. Yet upon
 conditions that if the said John Tirby sen^r shall observe
 forms such order or orders as this court shall make relative
 to be paid, maintenance of the aforesaid bastard child then this recognizance
 to be void.
