And on the motion of the said Executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said John Wellons and Charles Wellons with Abildonde Pitman and Joseph Casper their securities entered into and acknowledged their bonds in the penalty of Two thousand pounds current money of Virginia for the said John's and Charles's due and faithful administration of the said decedent's estate and performance of his will.

Ordered that Sampson Pitman, Charles Powers, Thomas Laid and Robert Couru or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of John Wellons decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.
