And on the motion of the said executor who makes oath according to law certificated is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Henry Davis with Charles Briggs his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One thousand pounds for the said Henry's due and fafull administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

An account current of the administration of the estates of John Turner decd. was reported, pursuant to the order of this court and ordered to be recorded.

Jacob Newsum of St. Lukes for a misdemeanor on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September 1778 - for a taking a negro named Chamee belonging to Palmer Newsum out of the hands of justice and setting him out of this state information by Benjamin Blunt. Benjamin Kirby for assaulting and beating Elijah Pope, on the 27<sup>th</sup> of October at Charles Pitt's Hottoway Parish - information by Elijah Pope. The overseer of the roads for not keeping the bridges in repair across the mill pond near Mrs. Simmons'. Hottoway parish. William Blunt
