The indenture of feoffment between Thomas Williamson of the one part and Thomas Clements Battle of the other part, a memorandum of livery of livery and a receipt thereon endorsed were proved by the oath of William Uryahart one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved by the oaths of two other witnesses are ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of Groves Sharp deed. was proved by the oaths of John Mundell and David Edmunds the of witnesses thereto and continued for the Executrix to qualify.

The indenture of feoffment between Abraham Jones of the one part and James Jones of the other part with a memorandum of livery of livery thereon endorsed was acknowledged by the said Abraham Jones and ordered to be recorded.

The inventory of the estate of William Austin deed. was returned and ordered to be recorded.

The indenture of feoffment between William Scott executor of the last will and testament of Edmund Gay deed. and James Taylor of the one part and Williams Williams of the other part was proved by the oaths of Richard Blon, Quaton Barnes and Andrew Pope the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

James Maget produced a commission from his Excellency the Governor to be second lieutenant of a company of militia of this county which was read, and thereupon the said James Maget having first taken the oath of fidelity to the commonwealth was sworn second lieutenant accordingly.

Joseph Marks produced an account against the commonwealth of Virginia for furnishing Ann Ellis the widow of Daniel Ellis a continental soldier and her two children with sundry articles to the amount of One hundred and one pound, sixteen shillings which was sworn to before Benjamin Blunt Gentlemen, a magistrate of this county, examined by the court and ordered to be certified.

Benjamin Blunt produced two several accounts against the commonwealth of Virginia to this court dated in 1748 & 1749 to the amount of Sixty nine pounds, seventeen shillings and six pence for furnishing Lucy Robinson widow of Hartovell Robinson a continental soldier with several articles to the amount of Forty two pounds twelve shillings and six pence, Also Twenty seven pounds five shillings for furnishing Ann Hargrave widow of Michael Hargrave a continental soldier with sundry articles
