An indenture of feoffment between David Bunn of the one part and Hardy Bunn of the other part and the receipt thereon endorsed were proved by the oaths of Joseph Mountford and Thomas Cherry two of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof.

An indenture of feoffment between Jonas Bryant of the one part and Jonas Bryant of the other part was acknowledged by the said Jonas Bryant and ordered to be recorded.

The persons appointed to let the building of a bridge across the raason swamp this day made their report in the following words to wit:

Whereupon it is ordered that the treasurer of this county pay unto the said Joshua Fort the said sum of Seventy one pounds for the same and amount thereof with the court.
