On the motion of Cutchins Counsel who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the will annex'd on the estate of Patience Bunn deceased giving security. Whereupon the said Cutchins Counsel with Thomas Lankford has security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Ten thousand pounds for the said Cutchins due ands faithfully to perform on the said decedents estate and performance of his will.

Ordered that Jos. Mountford, Thomas Mountford, Shadrach Lewis and Henry Joynes or any three of them being first sworn before justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Patience Bunn deceased and return the appraisement to the next court.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of Holliday's CrossJosiah Crocker a poor child of Sarah Crocker according to law.

Ordered that the court be adjourn'd till court in course.

The prisoner was led to the Bar by the gaoler to whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with feloniously breaking and entering the stonhouse of William Verghast of the parish of Holliday's Cross and county aforesaid on the 19th day of October in the eighth year and stealing from thence to the value of Four hundred and current money of Virginia of the goods and chattels of the said
