The persons appointed to allot, assign and set
apart the dower of the plaintiff on her late husband Geo. Jackson's
lands and estate this day made their report in the following words
to wit: In Obedience to an order of court we have laid off and set
apart the dower of Sarah Jackson relit of Geo. Jackson in the
plantation and land the said Jackson died seized off, and bounded
as followeth (that is to say) beginning at a lightwood stake in said
Jackson's line, thence to a persimmon tree in the cornfield,
thence a straight line to a pine by the side of the cornfield fence
thence a straight line to a small apple tree in the cornfield, thence
a straight line to a white oak in Matthew Williamson's line, thence
his line to a white oak Thomas Boone's corner, thence along said
Boone's line to Kindred Jackson's line, thence his line to the be-
ginning. Given under our hands this 20th day November 1779.
