

On the motions of James Levy and for sufficient reasons appearing to this court he is exempted from payment of levies during disability. James Roe, a soldier in the first Virginia regiment produced a discharge dated February 1762 from Adam Stephen, Col. of the said regiment and made satisfactory proof to the court that he was bona fide an inhabitant of her commonwealth at the time of passing the act of assembly in that case made, and provided and also made oath that he has never before, proved or obtained any warrant or certificate for such military services.

The last will and testament of Joseph Maskey dead was presented in court by Joshua Miniard one of the executors therein named proved by the oaths of Toomer Joyner, Martha Joyner, Ann Joyner and Elias Herring the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Joshua Miniard with Toomer Joyner his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Ten thousand pounds for the said Joshua's due and faithful administration on the said deceased's estate and performance of his wills.

Ordered that Henry Jones, Hardy Pike, Giles Johnsons and John Johnson or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Joseph Maskey dead and return the appraisement to the next court.

The last will and testament of Fortune Every dead was proved by the oaths of Mary Coggins and Ann Coggins two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of Pottorway bind out Jesse and James Ash orphans of William Ash dead according to law.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of St. Luke bind out Nancy Branch a poor child of Nancy Branch according to law.

A deed of Gift from Arthur Smith to Matthew Smith was proved by the oaths of Elias Herring, John Worrell and Benjⁿ Crumpler the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
