

Ordered that John Barrow, Joshua Nicholson, Joseph Farley and Jeremiah Drown or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves and personal estate of Ben^y Clements dead in the parish of A. Lake and return the appraisement to the next court.

Thomas Jones and Matthew Jones who stands bound by recognizance to appear here this day to answer a complaint exhibited against them for a breach of the peace appeared accordingly, whereupon the said Thomas & Matthew were fully heard, on consideration whereof it is ordered that the said Thomas and Matthew be committed to the custody of the sheriff of this county there to remain untill they shall give security for their good behaviour for the space of six months next ensuing and therein on the said Thomas Jones with Richard Telle his security and the said Matthew Jones with Bly Williams his security all of this county came into court and acknowledged themselves severally indebted to this our commonwealth in the sums following that is to say: the said Thomas and Matthew in the sum of Five hundred pounds each and the said Richard and Bly in the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds each of their respective lands and tenements, goods and chattles to be levied and to our said commonwealth rendered, yet upon this condition that if the said Thomas Jones and Matthew Jones shall be of good behaviour for the space of six months and pay the costs of this prosecution then this recognizance to be void.

For indenture of feoffment between Aaron Closser of the one part and James Bridger of the other part and the receipt thereon endors'd were proved by the oaths of Giles Whitney & Elisha Whitney two of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof.

On the motion of Job Wright and for sufficient reasons appearing to the court he is excused from the payment of parish and county taxes For indenture of feoffment between Anthony Colthorpe of the one part and Benjamin Deloach of the other part a memorandum of livery of seisin and a receipt thereon endors'd were proved by the oaths of William Urquhart and James Colthorpe two of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof.
