
Ordered that the court be adjourned till the court is called.

At a court of Oyer and Terminer held for the county of Southampton, on Saturday the 3^d day of February 1781, on the examination of Benjamin Paterson for entering the house of Jacob Pick and forcibly taking thence out on the 25th day of January 1781 sundry goods to the value of one hundred and fifty pounds to wit a bed quilt, Rug & two sheets.

The court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the bar and charged as aforesaid to which he pleaded not guilty. Whereupon divers witnesses were examined to wit Jacob Pick, Joshua Pick and John Jackson and the prisoner heard in his own defense, on consideration whereof it is the opinion of the court that the said prisoner be tried for the said offense at the next general court to be held in the city of Richmond, & thereupon he is remanded to goal to

Be it remembered that Jacob Pick, Joshua Pick and John Jackson came into court and acknowledged themselves indebted to the commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of Ten thousand pounds each of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied and to the said commonwealth rendered. Upon this condition that if each of them do personally appear at the next general court at the city of Richmond and there to give such evidence as they and each of them know against Benjamin Paterson concerning the matter wherewith he is charged, and that they do not depart thence without the leave of the said court then this recognizance to be void.
