This cause was this day heard on the bill of the Plaintiff and answers of the defendants, whereupon it is decreed and ordered that John Wilkinson, Edmund Day, Nathan Bryant or any two of them enquire into and state an account of the labour and profits of the slaves Henry and Jacob from the time of the death of Elizabeth Crafford the widow to the time of the death of the said John Crafford, and that the Sheriff make sale of the slaves aforesaid at public auction for ready money and make report thereof to the court.

On the motion of Nathan Barnes who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Burnell Barnes decd. giving security. Whereupon the said Nathan Barnes with Jones Bryant his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Fifty thousand pounds for the said Nathan's due and faithfull administration on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Edmund Barnes, Jacob Barrett, Thomas Pick and Micah Edwards or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and personal estate of Burnell Barnes decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.

On the motion of John Simmons who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Sarah Simmons decd. giving security. Whereupon the said John Simmons with Willoughby his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Fifty thousand pounds for the said John's due and faithfull administration on the estate of the said decedent

Ordered that Solomon Riphord, Rice B. Pierce, John Kirby and John Cobb or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and personal estate of Sarah Simmons decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.

For inventory and appraisement of the estate of John Roman decd. was retained, and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of James Lundy decd. was presented in court by James Lundy and Chester Morris the executors therein named bound by the oaths of Daniel Fisher and James Harris, two of the witnesses.
