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This cause was this day heard, on the bill of the
Plaintiff and answers of the defendants whereupon it is decreed and ordered
that John Wilkinson, Edmund Day, Nathans Bryant or any two of them
enquire into and state an account of the labour and profits of the slaves
Henry and Jacob from the time of the death of Elizabeth Crafford the widow
to the time of the death of the said John Crafford, and that the sheriff
make sale of the slaves aforesaid at public auction for ready money and make
report thereof to the court.

On the motions of Nathan Barnes who made oath according to law certificate
is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Burrwell
Barnes dead, giving security. Whereupon the said Nathan Barnes with Jonas
Bryant his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty
of Fifty thousand pounds for the said Nathan's due and faithful administration
on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Edmund Barrett, Jacob Barrett, Thomas Pick and Phineas
Edwards or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace
for this county do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and perso-
nal estate of Burrwell Barnes dead, and return the appraisement to the
next court.

On the motion of John Simmons who made oath according to law certificate is
granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Sarah
Simmons dead, giving security. Whereupon the said John Simmons with William
Viguerhart his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty
of Fifty thousand pounds for the said John's due and faithful administration
on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Solomon Shepherd, Rice B. Pierce, John Hardy and John
Cobb or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace
for this county do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and per-
sonal estate of Sarah Simmons dead, and return the appraisement to the
next court.

For inventory and appraisement of the estate of John Pitman dead, was
returned, and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of James Lundy dead, was presented in
court by James Lundy and Christian Morris the executors therein named
sworn by the oaths of Daniel Fisher and James Harris, two of the wit-
nesses.
