Lundy decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.

An indenture of feoffment between Benjamin Deloach and Ann his wife  
of the one part and Beverley Booth of the other part and the receipt thereon  
endors'd were proved by the oaths of Richards Bailey and Williams Booth two  
of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof.

Ordered that the court be adjourn'd till the court in course.

the next court.

The last will and testament of John Ivory decd. was proved by the oaths  
of Thomas Pate and Edward Pate two of the witnesses thereto and ordered  
to be recorded.
