Whereupon the said Richard Edwards with William Thomas his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One hundred thousand pounds for the said Richard's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay unto Jesse Whitehead One hundred and fifty pounds for repairing the prisons of this county & account thereof with the court.

Articles of agreement between Matthew Pick and Robert Husk were acknowledged by the said Matthew Pick and Robert Husk and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the court in course.
