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the oaths of two other witnesses, and a caveat having been /proposed against the recording of the said indenture the same is continued until the determination of a suit now depending in this court against the said Henry Johnson concerning the title of the lands conveyed in the said indenture.

A release from John Blunt to Bromfield and William Ridley Executors of the last will and testament of James Ridley deed. was acknowledged by the said John Blunt and ordered to be lodged in this court.

The last will and testament of James Ridley deed. was presented in court by Bromfield Ridley and William Ridley the executors therein named, proved by the oaths of Hardy Harris and John Blunt two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executors who made oath according to law, certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Bromfield Ridley and William Ridley with John Blunt and Hardy Harris their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One million of pounds for the said executors due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that Thomas Turner, Timothy Thorpe, Hardy Harris and James Jones or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of James Ridley deed. and return the appraisement to the next court.

An inventory of the estate of James Ridley deed. was returned and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of William Drury deed. was presented in court by William Drury one of the executors therein named, proved by the oaths of Jesse Cooper and Hardy Harris two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said William Drury with Hardy Harris and John Blunt his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred thousand pounds for the said William's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that Jacob Turner, Mich. Harris, Cardall Norflut and John Mundell or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Wm Drury deed. and return the appraisement to the next court.
