The last will and testament of William George dead. was presented in court by Benjamin Spratley and Ann George the executors therein named proved by the oaths of William Lane and William Kiggan two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executors who made oath according to law equitable is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Benjamin Spratley and Anne George with Philip Davis their security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two thousand pounds for the said executors due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent & performance of his will.

Ordered that John Mitchell, Joshua Wood, Thomas Wood and Brittain Francis or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and personal estate of William George dead. and return the appraisement to the next court.

James Wilson-Coker orphan of Nathaniel Coker dead came into court and chose Henry Branch his guardian. Whereupon the said Henry Branch with James B. Colthorpe his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One thousand pounds for securing the said orphan's estate and indemnifying the court.
