Whereupon the said David Barron with John Barron his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for the said David's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that Simon Johnson, John Johnson, Henry Jones & Micajah Griffin or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves, if any, and personal estate of Charles Hatfield dead, and return the appraisement to the next court.

Femina Hatfield widow and relict of Charles Hatfield dead, by writing under her hand, renounced all benefit she might receive by the last will of her deceased husband, Charles Hatfield which is ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of John Whitehead it is ordered that Jesse Whitehead, Josiah Turner and William Gwaltney or any two of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county impartially to perform the service do view the conveniences and inconveniences attending the turning of a road near the said John Whitehead's house and make report thereof to this court.

The last will and testament of Joseph Simmons dead, was proved by the oaths of Revitt Edwards and Joseph Pope two of the witnesses thereto and continued for the executors to qualify thereto.

The last will and testament of William Grosvitt dead, was proved by the oath of John Edwards one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved by the oath of another witness, sworn to by the executor and certificate granted is ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay unto Nathan Bygant the sum of Nine thousand nine hundred and ninety five pounds for the repairs of flat swamp bridges having regards to the depreciation on the aforesaid sum at the time of letting the said bridges and account thereof with this court.

An inventory of the estate of Thomas Everitt dead, was returned and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of cofferment between Nathan Britt senior, of the one part, and John Britt junior of the other part was proved by the oaths of John Gilliam and Edward Britt the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
