Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay unto Edmund Tyler the sum of Forty five pounds for the building of a bridge over Sausch near Arthur Washington's having regard to the depreciation on the aforesaid sum at the time of letting the said bridge and account thereof with the court.

On the motion of Thomas Bradsham who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Arthur Bradsham dead giving security. Whereupon the said Thomas Bradsham with three Bonding his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One hundred pounds for the said Thomas' due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Laurence Joyner, John Carristopher, William Doyle and Hardy Doyle or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Arthur Bradsham dead. and return the appraisement to the next court.

The last will and testament of Joseph Gilliam dead. was presented in court by John Gilliam the executor therein named Proved by the oaths of Edward Britt and Samuel Matthews two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said John Gilliam with Edward Britt his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for the said John's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that Nathan Britt junr, Neylon Everitt, John Barrett and John Britty or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal of Joseph Gilliam dead. and return the appraisement to the next court.

An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Charles Powers dead was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the court be adjourn'd till the court in course.
