An indenture of feoffment between Anthony Odwinn of the one part and
Patsy Person of the other part with the receipt thereon endorsed were proved by
the oaths of Benjamin Clifton, Thomas Turner and Jesse Clifton three of the
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between Jesse Britt of the one part and Moses
McHenry of the other part and the receipt thereon endorsed were proved by the
oaths of Joshua Harris and Lewis Harris two of the witnesses thereto and con-
tinued for further proof.

An inventory of the estate of Joseph Gilliam dead. was returned and ordered
to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between Samuel Tindred and Anne his wife,
Sarah Miller, John Kirby, James Vaughan and Phoebe his wife of the one
part and Nathan Bryant of the other part was proved by the oaths of
Nathan Harris, Andrews McNeal and Benjamin Turner the witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between Mary Johnson of the one part and
John Morgan of the other part was proved by the oaths of William Harris,
Moses McHenry and Jordan Baps three of the witnesses thereto, and a caveat
is now entered against the recording of the said deed by Samuel Westbrooke
untill the determination of a suit now depending in this court against the said
Mary Johnson concerning the title of the lands conveyed by the said indenture.

Phoebe Thorpe orphan of Aaron Thorpe dead. came into court and chose Hardy
Harris her guardian. Whereupon the said Hardy Harris with Jeremiah Drown
his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two
thousand pounds for securing the said orphans estate and indemnifying the
court.

The last will and testament of William Cleaveland dead. was proved by the
oath of Armistead Bellins one of the witnesses thereto and continued for fur-
ther proof.

On the motion of William Harrison who made oath according to law ar-
tefiate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration with the will
annex'd on the estate of William Cleaveland dead. giving security. Whereupon
the said William Harrison with William Urquhart his security entered
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One thousand pounds
for the said Harrison's due and faithfull administration on the estate of the
said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that Charles Briggs, William Hines, William Hines and
John Hines or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the
peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of
William Cleaveland dead. and return the appraisement to the next court.
