

Thomas Clements who was by the court appointed guardian to Sarah, Francis, Elizabeth and John Clements orphans of Benjamin Clements dead, the day appeared, and with Richard Blom and Miles Cary, his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of sixteen thousand pounds for securing the estates of the said orphans and indemnifying the court.

An indenture of feoffment between Mary Jackson of the one part and Nicholas Boon of the other part was proved by the oaths of John Chitty jun. John Boon, Newson Hill and John Chitty jun. the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

An account of the administrations of the estate of Robert Bailey dead was reported pursuant to the order of this court and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of Simon Murfee who made oath according to laws, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Richard Murfee dead, giving security. Whereupon the said Simon Murfee with Josiah Vick and Matthew Wells his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five hundred pounds for the said Simon's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that John Rochelle, Britain Jeyner, Albirdeton Jones junior and William Williams or any three of them being first sworn, before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any, & personal estate of Richard Murfee dead, and return the appraisement to the next court.

On the motion of Milly Williams who made oath according to laws certificate is granted her for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Bly Williams dead, giving security. Whereupon the said Milly Williams with Stephen Summerell her security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for the said Milly's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Arthur Boykin, John Summerell, James Summerell and John Britt or any three of them being first sworn, before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any, and personal estate of Bly Williams dead, and return the appraisement to the next court.

The persons appointed to let the rebuilding of Buckhorn bridge, made their report in the following words: "14th February 1782. In obedience to an order of Southampton court, we have let the rebuilding of Buckhorn bridge to Thomas Fitzhugh for Seventeen hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco and to be completed by the last day of March next by Mark, Hindson, Arthur Foster, John Fort.
