

The inventory and appraisement of the estate of Richard Johnson dead. 203.
was returned and ordered to be recorded.

The persons appointed to view the conveniences and inconveniences attending the turning of a road near Josiah Vick's this day made their report in the following words to wit: In obedience to an order of Southampton county court bearing date March court 1782. to us directed we the subscribers being sworn have impartially viewed the place for turning the road near Josiah Vick's and find that the turning the same is no inconvenience to publick nor private persons. Given under our hands this 24th of April 1782. James Butler, John Johnson, Benjamin Waller. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Josiah Vick have leave to turn the said road according to the prayer of his petition.

The last will and testament of Jesse Drows dead. was proved by the oath of Timothy Thorpe one of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof. An indenture of feoffment between Jeremiah Drows and Thomas Fitzhugh of the one part and Anne Drows widow & relict of Jesse Drows dead, and Jesse Drows his son an infant of the other part was acknowledged by the said Jeremiah Drows and Thomas Fitzhugh and ordered to be recorded.

An account of the administration of the estate of Thomas Turner dead. was reported pursuant to the order of this court and ordered to be recorded.

A deed of gift from James Vick to Joseph Vick was acknowledged by the said James Vick and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of Christopher Wade dead. was presented in court by Joshua Brantley the executor therein named. proved by the oaths of Joseph Mountfortt and Samuel Turner two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motions of the said executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Joshua Brantley with Jordan Denson his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds with condition as the law directs for the said probat due and faithfull administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will.

Ordered that Joseph Mountfortt, Henry Jeyser, Thomas Mountfortt and William Jeyser or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves, if any, and personal estate of Christopher Wade dead. and return the appraisements to the next court.

Ann Wade widow and relict of Christopher Wade dead. personally appeared in court and relinquished all benefit and advantage she might receive under the last will and testament of her said husband.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Luke bind
