Summerell and ordered to be recorded.

An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Henry Williams deed was re-
corded and ordered to be recorded.

The persons appointed by the last will and testament of James Lundy deed to
make an equal division and partition between Darling Adams, Edwin Adams
and Colin Adams sons of Mary Adams of the following slaves to wit. Pat, Dick,
Milley, Herbert, Nat, John, George, Lewis & Jemmy this day reported as follows to
set: Pursuant to the last will of James Lundy deed we the subscribers have allotted
and set apart to Darling, Edwin & Colin Adams the following negroes to wit:

To Darling Adams Neg. Patt, Herbert & Jemmy, the said Darling Adams is to
pay three hundred and thirty three, pounds six shillings and eight pence. To Ed-
win Adams Negroes Dick, Nat and Lewis, the said Edwin Adams to receive
one hundred sixty six pounds thirteen and four pence. To Colin Adams Neg:
George, Milley and John, the said Colin Adams to receive one hundred sixty
six pounds thirteen and four pence. Given under our hands this 5th day of
April 1781. /Signed/ William Blunt, Lewis Thorp, John Myrick.

On the motion of Samuel Scarborough, Benjamin Bradley who has formerly
bound to him is released from his indenture, and it is ordered that the church-
wardens of the parish of Holtonway bind the said Bradley to Stephen Summerell
according to law.

The last will and testament of Jeppe Dowd deed was proved by the oath of Ri-
chard Blow, one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved by the
oath of Timothy Thorpe another witness thereto is ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of Priscilla Blunt deed was presented in
court by John Blunt the executor therein named proved by the oaths of
of Nathan Bryant and Calia Bryant two of the witnesses thereto and
ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executor who made
oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof
in due form giving security. Whereupon the said John Blunt with Wm
Blunt his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty
of five thousand pounds with condition as the law directs for the said
John's due and faithfull administration on the estate of the said deceased
and performance of his will.
