

as the defendant in his proper person who confessed the plaintiff's action for One hundred and three thousand pounds the debt in the declarations mentioned. Therefore on the motion of the said plaintiff by his attorney it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said One hundred and three thousand pounds and his costs by him about his suit in that behalf expended, and the said defendant in mercy &c. But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged at the rate of one hundred and fifty for one.

Etheldred Holt who stands bound by recognizance to appear here this day to answer the complaint of James Atkinson against him for a breach of the peace appeared accordingly whereupon the said Etheldred Holt and James Atkinson were fully heard, on consideration whereof it is ordered that the said Holt be committed to the custody of the Sheriff of this county there to remain until he shall give security for his good behaviour for the space of six calendar months, and thereupon the said Etheldred Holt with Jesse Holt and Nathaniel Pope his securities all of this county came into court and acknowledged themselves severally indebted to their own commonwealth in the sums following that is to say: the said Etheldred Holt in the sum of Fifty pounds and the said Jesse Holt and Nathaniel Pope securities each in the sum of Twenty five pounds of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied and to our said commonwealth rendered. Upon this condition that if the said Etheldred Holt shall be of good behaviour towards all the inhabitants of this commonwealth but more especially towards the said James Atkinson for the space of six calendar months next ensuing then this recognizance to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.

Ordered that the court be adjourn'd till to morrow morning ten o'clock
