

Thomas Tiddy is by the court appointed guardian to Henry & Priscilla Tiddiborn orphans of Jacob Tiddiborn decd. Whereupon the said Thomas Tiddy with John Barrow his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One thousand pounds for securing the said orphans estates and indemnifying the court.

Ordered that the sheriff summon 24 of the freeholders of this county not being ordinary keepers, constables, surveyors of highways or owners or occupiers of a mill to appear at the courthouse on the second thursday in November next and be sworn a grand jury of inquest on the body of this county.

Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay Edmund Tyler one hundred & fifty pounds of tobacco for 300 feet of plank found for the lightwood bridge and account thereof with the court.

The inventory of the estate of John Browne decd. was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Thomas Woodleaf having obtained an attachment against the estate of Frances Goodwyn who hath presently removed himself out of the county of Dinwiddie or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him for a debt due to the said Thomas Woodleaf. William Hines deputy sheriff of this county now made return that he had executed the said attachment in the hands of Charles Taylor and that he had summoned him as a garnishee. This day came as well the plaintiff as the said garnishee who being first sworn deposed that he hath a horse the property of the said defendant in his possession. Whereupon on the motion of the plaintiff who served his demands to be just it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant One hundred eleven pounds two shillings and three pence together with interest thereon from Decr. 21st 1798 till paid and his costs by him in this behalf expended, and it is ordered that the garnishee deliver the said horse to the sheriff, and that the sheriff sell him at public auction for ready money and therewith discharge the aforesaid judgment and costs, or so much thereof as the sale of the said horse will amount to.

Thomas Simmons who stands bound by recognizance to appear here this day to answer the complaints of Sarah Moore against him for begetting a bastard child on the body of the said Sarah, appeared accordingly. Whereupon the said Thomas Simmons and John Simmons of William her security acknowledged themselves severally indebted in the sum of Fifty pounds of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied, yet upon this condition that if the said Thomas Simmons shall provide sufficient maintenance for the said child until it shall arrive to a proper age to be bound out then this recognizance to be void else to remain in full force power and virtue.
