An indenture of possession between Philip Moody of the one part and
John Andrews of the other part with receipt therein endorsed were
acknowledged by the said Philip Moody and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of Sarah Beale dead. was presented in
court by Henry Doles the executor therein named proved by the oaths of
Robert Washington and Elizabeth Williams two of the witnesses therein
ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executor who
made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a
probate thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said
Doles with John Wood his security entered into and acknowledged the
same. Bond in the penalty of One thousand pounds for the said
Doles due and faithful administration on the estate of the said dead
and performance of his will.

Ordered that Lazarus Cook, Elijah Crocker, Moses Johnson and
Henry Turner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice
of the peace of this county, do appraise in current money the slaves
if any and personal estate of Sarah Beale dead: and return the ap-
praisement to the next court.

Ordered that George Gurley, William Thomas and Josiah Oik or
any two of them examine, state and settle an account current
of the estate of Joseph Johnson dead. and make report thereof to this
court.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of Nottoway bind out
* Polly John, Benjamin and Jacob Jenkins orphans of Jacob Jenkins dead.
into law.

An account current of the administration of the estate of Francis Beale
dead was reported pursuant to the order of this court and ordered to be re-
corded.

Ordered that Samson Pitman, Thomas Lane and Moses Phelps or
any two of them let the repairs of round hill causeway to the lowest
undertaker and make report thereof to this court.
