This day came as well the plaintiff by his attorney as the defendants
 Horwell Edmunds and John Wood in their proper persons who confessed the plain-
 tiffs action for Three thousand two hundred and eleven pounds and two shillings
 the debt in the declaration mentioned. Therefore on the motion of the said plaintiff
 by his attorney it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said
 defendants the said three thousand two hundred and eleven pounds two shillings and
 his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended, and the said defendant in
 money &c. And the defendant Daniel Mappengale being returned no inhabitant is
 is ordered that this suit abate as to him.

But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the
 payment of Sixteen hundred and five pounds eleven shillings together with interest
 thereon from October 5th 1780 till paid.

On the motion of Moses Johnson who made oath according to law certificate is granted
 him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Poole decd. going
 security. Whereupon the said Moses Johnson with Henry Poole his security entered
 into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for the
 said Moses due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent.

Ordered that Mathews Wills, Abraham Mitchell, Simon Murphree and John
 Johnson or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this
 county do appraise in current money the slave (if any) and personal estate and
 of William Poole decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.

Ordered that the treasurer pay Henry Westbrooke One hundred and fifty five
 pounds for the rebuilding of Smith bridge across the three creeks the sum ap-
 pointed to view the same having reported that it was completed according to agree-
 ment.

Ordered that the court be adjourn'd till to morrow morning ten o'clock
