

Ordered that Nicholas Maget Gent. take the list of taxable property, and number of souls in the district composed by the militia company, commanded by Capt. Jesse Whitehead. Benjamin Blunt Gent. in the district composed by Capt. Thomas Turner in Capt. Webb's companies of militia. Thomas Turner in Capt. Blunt's company. William Blunt in Capt. Barrows company, Timothy Thorpe in Capt. Taylor's company, John Rogers Gent. in Capt. Myrick's company and John Simmons in Capt. Hyman and Capt. Lewis companies of militia, and that the same persons who took the list of tithables last year do the same this year as also the number of souls in those districts not herein before laid of except Jesse Whitehead Gent. to take the list in Capt. Mitchell's company and Edwin Gray in Capt. Kelle's company.

The last will and testament of Anne Crenshaw dead, was presented in court by Jacob Bailey the executor therein named, proved by the oath of Samuel Moore one of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof. And on the motion of the said executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said Jacob Bailey with Howell Whitington his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five hundred pounds for the said Jacob Bailey's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said deceased and performance of her will.

Ordered that Titus Carr, William Gwaltney, Edmund Spencer and William Thomas or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county, do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and personal estate of Anne Crenshaw dead, and return the appraisement to the next court.

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the court in course.
