Whereupon the said William Daughan with Thomas Holladay his security and David Edwards with Samuel Dyer his security severally acknowledged themselves indebted to this our commonwealth that is to say the said Daughan and Edwards in the sum of ^{five} hundred and fifty pounds each and their securities in the sum of ~~£250~~ ^{five} hundred and fifty pounds each and Geo. Gurley jr. with Geo. Gurley his security & Ben^t Edwards with George Edwards his security acknowledged themselves indebted to this our commonwealth the principals in the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds each and their securities in the sum of one hundred twenty five pounds each of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied and to this our commonwealth rendered upon this condition that they and each of them be of good behaviour to the larger part of this commonwealth particularly to the said Isaac Williams and appear at the next grand jury to answer an indictment to be preferred against and pay also the costs of this prosecution

The persons appointed to lett the repairs of the cause way over round hills bridge the day made their report in the following words to wit: "In obedience to an order of the worshipful court of Southampton we the subscribers have lett the repairing of the causeway over round hills near Robert Exors's to Arthur Exors for the sum of £29.19.0 which is completed according to the agreement entered into with us by said Moses Phillips, Larn^r. Attest. March 12. 1783 William it is ordered that the treasurer of this county pay unto the said Arthur Exors the said twenty nine pounds nineteen shillings and account thereof with the court

On the motion of Arthur Turner who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Littleton Turner dead giving security. Whereupon the said Arthur Turner with Alexander Murray and Thomas Holladay his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two thousand pounds for the said Arthur due faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent

Ordered that Michael Harris, John Blunt, William Drury and Hardy Harris or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of the county, do appraise in current money the slaves and personal estate of Littleton Turner dead. and return the appraisement to the next court.

The last will and testament of Philip Moody dead. was presented in court by John Andross one of the executors therein named the others refusing / sworn by the oaths of William Barnes and Jerry Williams two of the witnesses thereof and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said John Andross with William Boykin his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Three thousand pounds for the said John's due and faithful administration
