Def. { On an injunction to stay the proceedings of
a judgment at common law obtained by

said James Bullard for Eleven pounds seventeen shillings and eight pence with interest
from Decr. 25th 1769 till payment.

This cause was this day heard on the bill of the complainant, answer
of the defendant and arguments of the council on both sides, on consideration whereof
it is deemed and ordered that the said William Stewart all and singular his coun-
sell, attorneys, solicitors &c be perpetually enjoined from any proceeding whatsoever at
common law against the said James Bullard as to the sum of ten pounds ten
shillings, and that the said William Stewart the plaintiff at common law be at
liberty to proceed to execution as to the balance of one pound seven shillings and eight
pence with interest thereon from Decr. 25th 1769 till payment and that the defend-
ant at common law pay unto the plaintiff the costs by him about this injunction in that
behalf expended

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and thereupon came also
a jury to wit: Philip Davis, William Bricklow, Isaac Williams, William Barnes,
John Kirby, Britain Jeyner, Barnaby Drake, James Butts, John Andrews Sa-
muel Wright, William Simmons, and Holladay Sewell who being sworn diligently
to enquire what damages the plaintiff hath sustained by the occasion in the declaration
mentioned upon their oath do say that the plaintiff hath sustained damage by occasions
mentioned to Seven pounds eight shillings and six pence one farthing besides his costs.
Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said de-
fendant his damages aforesaid in form aforesaid appraised and his costs by him
about his suit in that behalf expended, and the said defendant in money &c
On the motion of William Beale who made oath according to law certificate is granted
him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Priscilla Beale and giving
security, whereupon the said William Beale with Richard Beale his security en-
tered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one hundred pounds for the said
William Beale's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent
Ordered that David Wright, James Wright, William Williams and James Edwards
or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county, do
appraise in current money the slaves of any and personal estate of Priscilla Beale
decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.
