Figures, Josiah Hatfields, Thomas Curle and William Willson and make
report thereof to this court

Pursuant to an act of assembly entitled, "an act concerning pensioners," this
court hath enquired into the condition and bodily ability of William Simmons
a pensioner of this commonwealth and certify that it appears the said Simmons
hath received several wounds at Beauford's defeat which have rendered his
left arm useless and otherways unfit for labour

Ordered that the court be adjourn'd till the court in course

his negroes Will Cooper & Belinda are exempted from payment of taxes county
and parish levies in future

William Millar dead. was reported by the persons appointed to settle the same
