and bill were acknowledged by the said John Blythe senior and Charity his wife  
she being first privately examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded.

Absent Muzajah Holliman Present Nicholas Maget Gentlemen

The last will and testament of William Williford decd. was presented in court by  
Belah Williford and Jordan Williford the executors therein named proved by the  
oaths of Muzajah Holliman and William Boykin two of the witnesses thereto and  
ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executors who made oath accord-  
ing to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form  
giving security. Whereupon the said Belah Williford and Jordan Williford with  
Thomas Bock and Muzajah Holliman their securities entered into and acknow-  
ledged their bond in the penalty of one thousand pounds for the said executors  
due and faithfull administration on the estate of the said decedent and per-  
formance of his will.

Ordered that Richard Edwards, Thormon Harris, Benjamin Harris and Ber-  
nell Williamson or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of  
this county do appraise in current money the slaves (if any) and personal estate of  
this county and return the appraisement to the next court.

William Williford decd. and return the appraisement to the next court.  
Pursuant to the last will and testament of Thomas Drake decd. Absalom Jones  
returned a report of a line run by him to divide the lands of Jordan Denson from  
the lands devised to helia Drake in the following words to wit. In witness whereof  
the last will and testament of Tho<sup>s</sup> Drake decd. bearing date the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March 1709. I have run a line dividing the  
lands devised to Jordan Denson from the lands devised to helia Drake & Joseph Jeyner which bounds the lands devised  
to the said Jordan Denson as follows to wit beginning at a dead oak at the upper corner of <sup>the</sup> land adjoining the lands of  
Absalom Jones & Lewis Jeyner & the said Denson's land whereon Timothy Drake now lives thence said by an old line to a branch of the  
said line down the branch to a Gum thence a pretty straight line of newly marked trees (which divides the said land from the  
lands devised to the said helia's (or Jeyner) to a lightwood post in the line which divides the lands devised to the said Jordan Denson  
from the lands of Benjamin Williford & the lands of J<sup>r</sup> Denson whereon Timothy Drake now lives & thence the 2<sup>d</sup> line to the beginning  
where a lightwood post is to be substituted instead of the dead oak Gum undermy hand & seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day 1709. Absalom Jones Secy

An inventory and appraisement of the estate of William Hope decd. was returned  
and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of Absalom Jones and for sufficient reasons appearing to the court  
the negroes Rachel, Rose, Maria, Nan, Sarah & Aggy are exempted from payment  
of their parish and county taxes in future
