

On the motion of Ann Kirby who made oath according to law certificate is granted her for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Turner Kirby deceased giving security. Whereupon the said Ann Kirby with Henry Turner her security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Three thousand pounds for the said Ann's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said deceased.

X- Ordered that William Edmunds, Thomas Holladay, John Barrow and John Powell or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Turner Kirby deceased and return the appraisement to the next court.

Ordered that Edmund Tyler, Arthur Bowin and Lawrence Joynes or any two of them examine, state and settle an account current of the estate of David well Crocker deceased and make report thereof to this court.

The last will and testament of John Clark deceased was presented in court proved by the oaths of John Woodward and Benjamin Harris two of the witnesses thereto (except the interlining of the word Judith in the 11th line) and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James Lancaster (Arthur Williamson and Micayah Holliman the executors on the said will named refusing the burden of the execution thereof) who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration with the said will annex'd giving security. Whereupon the said James Lancaster with Micayah Holliman his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five thousand pounds for the said James Lancaster's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said deceased and performance of his will.

Ordered that Barnwell Williamson, William Williamson, Herman Rand and Benjamin Harris or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of John Clark deceased and return the appraisement to the next court.

An indenture of bargain and sale between William Morgan and Mary his wife of the one part and Arthur Turner of the other part was proved by the oaths of Lazarus Cook and Elijah Crocker two of the witnesses thereto contained for further proof.

On the motion of Hardy Dogell who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Dogell deceased giving security. Whereupon the said Hardy Dogell with Capt Dogell his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Twenty five pounds for the said Hardy's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said deceased.

Ordered that Moses Johnson, Arthur Bowin, Lawrence Joynes and John Johnson or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of William Dogell deceased and return the appraisement to the next court.
