An indenture of bargain and sale between Charles Barrett of the one part and William Urquhart of the other part and the receipt thereon endorsed were proved by the oaths of Solomon Holmes and Samuel Mecom two of the witnesses thereto and continued for further proof

On the motion of Charles Briggs a witness for Henry Allen against Howell Briggs it is ordered that the said Henry Allen pay him one hundred pounds of tobacco for four days attendance on this court according to law.

An account current of the estate of Simon Stephenson dead. was reported by the persons formerly appointed to examine state and settle the same and ordered to be recorded

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Luke bind out Littleberry Hicks a poor child of Semina Hicks to Henry Thorpe according to law

On the motion of William Westral he having offered sufficient reasons to the court his son Robert is exempted from payment of taxes parish and county levies in future
