The indenture of bargain and sale between Ann Fowler widow of William Fowler decd.
and Benjamin Fowler son of the said William of the one part and James Barnes of the other
part was acknowledged by the said Ann and Benjamin Fowler and ordered to be re-
corded

The indenture of bargain and sale between Lileston Long of the one part and Ethelred
Draville, William Hines and John Powell of the other part was proved by the oaths of
Benjamin Blunt and Benjamin Hindred two of the witnesses thereto and continued
to further proof.

The last will and testament of Henry Wellons decd. was presented in court by Ellen Wellons
his executrix therein named proved by the oath of Thomas Lane ^{junr} of the witnesses thereto who also
deposed that he saw Henry Powers an other witness who is since dead sign his name thereto
at the publishing thereof and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said executrix who
made oath according to law certificate is granted her for obtaining a probat thereof in due form
giving security. Whereupon the said Ellen Wellons with Thomas Lane her security entered
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for the said Ellen
due and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of
his will

Ordered that Thomas Lane, William Wellons, Sampson Poman and Charles Priors or any
three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in current
money the slaves if any and personal estate of Henry Wellons decd. and return the appraisement
to the next court

The indenture of bargain and sale between Benjamin Faircloth and Phoebe his wife of
one part and Benjamin Faircloth junr of the other part was proved by the oaths of John
Hindred, Benjamin Hindred and John Barrows the witnesses thereto and ordered to be re-
corded

The last will and testament of William Moore decd. was presented in court proved by the
oaths of James Jones and Thomas Scott two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and testament of John Wilkinson decd. was presented in court by John Wit-
kinson and James Wilkinson (the executors therein named) proved by the oaths of Simon Everett
Hinson and Thomas Edmunds two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion
of the said executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining
a probat thereof in due form giving security. Whereupon the said John and James Wilkinson
with George Farley and Thomas Edmunds their securities entered into and acknowledged
their bond in the penalty of Five thousand pounds for the said executors due and faithful
administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will

Ordered that Nathan Bryant, Lazarus Cook, John Hindred and John Baykin or
any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise
in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of John Wilkinson decd. and
return the appraisement to the next court
