An indenture of bargain and sale between Littleton Long of the one part and Etheldred Brabley William Bines and John Powell of the other part, was proved by the oath of William Turner one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved by the oaths of two other witnesses is ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between David Young and Hannah his wife of the one part and John Barrons of the other part with a memorandum of living of seisin and receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said David Young and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of bargain and sale between Simon Wick Patience his wife of the one part and Jonas Bryant of the other part was proved by the oaths of Andrew Mial William Pope & Jesse Wick the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

Philip Davis produced to the court an instrument of writing under his hand & seal emancipating the following ^{viz} slaves to wit Pier, Isabel, Eliek, Peter Bon & Lydia which was acknowledged by the said Philip Davis & ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of gift from George Briggs to Charles Briggs for Trudy one slave therein named was proved by the oaths of Etheldred Davis Edwin Davis & Charles Briggs the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of gift from George Briggs to Benjamin Blunt twelve slaves named therein was proved by the oaths of Charles Briggs s^r & Charles Briggs j^r the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

William Appleswhite nephew of Arthur Appleswhite ^{and} came into court & chose Arthur Appleswhite for his guardian whereupon he s^d Arthur with J^r Appleswhite his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five hundred Pounds for the s^d Arthur securing the s^d Appleswhite estate & inasmuch as the court
