An indenture of bargain and sale between Littleton Long of the one part and Etheldred Brabley, William Jones and John Powell of the other part, was proved by the oath of William Turner one of the witnesses thereto and having been heretofore proved by the oaths of two other witnesses is ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of giftment between David Young and Hannah his wife of the one part and John Barrons of the other part with a memorandum of living of seison and receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said David Young and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of bargain and sale between Simon Wick Patience his wife of the one part and Thomas Bryant of the other part was proved by the oaths of Andrew Mial, William Popham & Jesse Wick the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

Philip Davis produced to the court an instrument of writing under his hand & seal emancipating the following ^{viz} slaves to wit, Pier, Isabel, Elick, Peter Poon & Lydia which was acknowledged by the said Philip Davis & ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of gift from George Briggs to Charles Briggs for twenty one slaves therein named was proved by the oaths of Etheldred Davis Edwin Davis & Charles Briggs the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of gift from George Briggs to Benjamin Blunt twelve slaves therein named was proved by the oaths of Charles Briggs s^r & Charles Briggs j^r the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

William Appleshite nephew of Arthur Appleshite ^{and} came into court & chose Arthur Appleshite for his guardian whereupon he s^r Arthur with his Appleshite his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds for the said business concerning the s^r Appham estate & inasmuch as the Court
