Jaest Turner & William Kitchen came into court & undertook for the defendant Jagger that in case he should be cast in this suit that they should pay & satisfy the condemnation of the court & render his body to prison in discharge thereof or that they would do it for him. Whereupon the s^d Jaest Turner & William Kitchen brought here into court the body of s^d Jagger & surrendered him in discharge of their Recognizance ~~for~~ ^{for}. And thereupon from their Recognizance they were released. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney & the defendant in custody of the sheriff confessed the plaintiff's action of for £ 14. 12 the debt in the declaration mentioned to be just.

Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the s^d Defendant Jagger the s^d fourteen pounds twelve shillings & his costs by him about his suit in this behalf offered. Whereupon as the prayer of the plaintiff the s^d Defendant is charged in custody of the sheriff in execution of this judgment & costs. But the s^d Judgment ^{except the costs} may be discharged by the payment of seven pounds six shillings with interest thereon at five p^{er} cent from the 1st day of May 1784 till payment.

And the other defendant Johnson being arrested & not appearing. On the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney it is ordered that judgment be entered against the s^d Defendant Johnson & Lewis Jagger as security for his appearance for the debt in the declaration mentioned unless the s^d Defendant Johnson appears & pleads at the next court.

THE! Blake who ^{stands} is bound by Recognizance to appear here the day to answer the complaint of Mary Nicholson against him for breach of the peace appeared accordingly & the parties being fully heard it is ordered by the court that the s^d Thomas Blake be committed to the custody of the sheriff of this county there to remain until he will give security for his good behavior for the space of twelve months, himself in £ 500. & his security in £ 250. which the Thomas failing to do he continued in custody &c.
