John Saunders having obtained an attachment against the estate of William Little
the said John Saunders removed himself or so absconded that the ordinary process of the law
remained to be served upon him This day came the plaintiffs by his attorney & the sheriff making
return that he had levied the attachment on a horse the property of the Defendant and
and he not appearing to replace the property Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff
it is ordered by the Court that he recover against the said Defendant nine
hundred and sixty nine pounds of Virginia inspected Tobacco with interest thereon
the rate of 5 per cent per annum from the day of . . . till payment & his costs
by him in this behalf expended And it is ordered that the sheriff sell at public auction for
the best price in ready money that can be had the aforesaid horse & that the money arising
therefrom pay and satisfy the plaintiff the amount of this judgment & costs if the money
arising from the sale is sufficient & that he return an act of his proceedings to the Clerk

John Hood having obtained an attachment against the estate of Daniel Maffington who hath privately removed himself or so absconded that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served on him for a debt due to the said Hood. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney & the defendant and being ~~read~~ ^{in fact} ~~read~~ appearing shortly making return that he had secured the attachment on two negroes James & Bethe of the Defendants & not appearing to uphold the S^r property therefore on the motion of the plaintiff it is ordered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the D^f Defendants sixteen hundred and five pounds eleven shillings paper currency at interest thereon at the rate of 5% p^{er} annum from the 5th of October 1780 till payment. And it is ordered by the Court that the debt is to be discharged 4000 l^{rs} specie by the scale of Depreciation established by Law for the month of October 1780 And it is ordered that the Sheriff sell at public auction for the best price in ready money that can be had giving legal notice of the time & place of such sale the four negro slaves James and Bethe & from the money arising from the sale pay to the plaintiff the amount of this judgment & that if the same is sufficient to return an account of his proceedings herein to this Court

Aaron Heathcock having obtained an attachment against the estate of Elijah Hunt
 who hath privately removed himself or so absconds that the ordinary process of the state
 cannot be served upon for a debt due by bond from the S^d Hunt to the Heathcocks
 This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the sheriff making return that he had
 executed the attachment. One feather bed bolster some sheet one saddle a peppin
 hop two brushes twelve hogs two skeins of thread one slat truss two waistcoats one
 coat one shirt some stock and the Defendant not appearing to reply the attach-
 ed effects Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the
 said Defendant sixteen pounds four shilling currency of the state of North
 Carolina to be discharged by payment of Eight pounds four shillings same
 currency and the costs thereon at the rate of 5% of annum from the 1st
 of July 1784 till payment and his costs by him in his behalf expended
 And it is Ordered that the sheriff sell the above attached property at public sale
 for ready money giving due notice of the time & place of sale & that if the sale should
 missing therefrom pay to the plaintiff the above judgment & costs if the sale should
 be sufficient return and sat. of his proceedings to this Court
