"belonging to Thomas Blunt deceased in the bill mentioned equally among

"the plaintiffs Vizt. No 1 Negro Wally to Samuel Edmunds &c he to pay

"the sum of £20. 10s. 7d No 2 Young Judy to Ann Blunt &c he to pay

"the sum of £16. 6s. 7d No 3 negro Patti & Young Wally to Joseph Blunt

"he to pay the sum of £19. 2s. 7d No 4 Negro old Judy to Mills

"Godwin &c he to pay the sum of £9. 18 all which sums make £60. 4s.

No 5 negroes Jenny & Kate to Henry Blunt &c he to receive the sum of

£8. 13s. 5d No 6 Negro Isham to Thomas Blunt &c he to receive the sum

of £24. 5s. 5d No 7 negro Pompey to Edmund Blunt &c he to receive

the sum of £29. 5s. 6d all which make the sum of £60. 4s. 4d which

they are to receive in ready money if not to carry interest from the

18<sup>th</sup> day of December 1783 Given under our hands this 11<sup>th</sup> day

of November 1784 signed John Thomas Blow Thos. Blunt

John Simmons & John Rochelle Whereupon it is ordered

that the said Report be the Decree of this Court & that the same be from
