"N^o 5 negroes Jimmy & Kate to Henry Blunt she to receive the sum of

"£8. 13. 5 N^o 6 Negro Isham to Thomas Blunt she to receive the sum
"of £24. 5. 5 N^o 7 negro Pompey to Edmund Blunt she to receive

"the sum of £29. 5. 6 all which make the sum of £60. 14. 4 which
"they are to receive in ready money if not to carry interest from the

"18th day of December 1783 Given under our hands this 11th
"of November 1784 Signed John Thomas Blunt Tho. Smith
