This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the sheriff making return that he had levied the attachment awarded against the estate of the defendant at the last court upon one bed and the defendant not appearing to repay the same therefore on the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant seven pounds eleven shillings and six pence the debt in the declaration mentioned & his costs to him in this suit £15/- and the said defendant is to pay the Bed this judgment except the debt is to be discharged by the payment of Thirteen pounds fifteen shillings Eleven pence worth interest thereon at 5% per annum from the 25<sup>th</sup> of December 1776 till payment - now the plaintiff releases in full the attached debt

This day came the plaintiff by Richard Rele his attorney and the defendants with ravining their former pleading they cannot gainsay the plaintiff's action nor has they own the beds in the declaration mentioned therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the 1<sup>st</sup> defendant £9 12s 3d the debt on the 3<sup>d</sup> declaration mentioned and his costs by him abt his suit in his behalf expended and the 2<sup>d</sup> defendant to pay the Bed this judgment except the debt is to be discharged by the payment of four pounds six shillings and six pence due thereon at 5% per annum from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1784 till payment  
The plaintiff agrees to stay his suit 1 month
