An Indenture of bargain and sale between Willson Wade and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and Jacob Lovell of the other part with a receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said Willson Wade & Eliz<sup>t</sup> his wife she being first examined at the law courts & Ordained to be recorded

= Joseph Reese and Mary Rees orphans of Edward Reese came into court & chose John Reese as their guardian Whereupon the said John Reese with Henry Thorpe his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for the securing the said orphans estates and indemnifying the court

The last will & testament of James Stoney was presented in court by Daniel Story the Esq<sup>r</sup> therin named and proved by the oaths of Drury Beale & John Willson witnesses thereto & was to be recorded and on the motion of the said Esq<sup>r</sup> who made oath according to Law Attested was granted him for obtaining a probat therof in due form giving security Whereupon the said Daniel Story with his security entered into and acknowledged their bond on the penalty of

for securing the said debts estate & administering the same according to Law performance of his will

Ordered that Drury Beale Jr. Drake Horrell Whitehill & John Greenshaw or any two of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise on current money the pleasure of any personal estate of James Stoney deceased return the appraisement to the next court
