This day came the plaintiffs by their attorney and the defendant in his proper person who confessed the plaintiffs action to be just for Thirty four pounds current money of Virginia the debt in the declaration mentioned. There-

8 15/ four pounds current money of Virginia and their costs by them on this behalf expended & be in mercy &c. But this judgment except the costs is to be discharged by the payment of Seventeen pounds and nine pence with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1774 till paid. Mem<sup>o</sup> that the plaintiffs acknowledge satisfaction 1777 June 26<sup>th</sup> for one pound fourteen shillings and 1778 Febr<sup>y</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> for nine shillings in part of this judgment, and also agree to stay execution of the said judgment three months from this day.
